Easter

Today, we celebrate the greatest feast of the Church's year, the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. In the Old Testament we have the prophesy of Jonah, just as Jonah was in the belly of the whale for three days, so the Son of God was in the



heart of the earth for three days, before he rose, as he promised. He said "Destroy this temple and in three days I will rebuild it", he was speaking of the



temple of His own body which He rebuilt by rising on the first Easter Dav. By rising from the dead Jesus proved beyond all doubt that he was the Son of God. Many who were at the foot of the cross on Good Friday looked on Jesus as a failure, they said "If you are the Son of God come down from the cross", others said "He saved others let him save himself, if he is the Son of God." When he died

they walked sadly away. Just imagine what would have happened if Jesus had failed to rise from the dead! Christianity would have soon been forgotten. Jesus would have been remembered as a good man, but not who he claimed to be. The apostles would have gone back fishing, tax collecting, etc. We gather in Churches throughout the world today to celebrate the greatest event the world has experienced, the Resurrection of Jesus, the Son of God, from the dead. By rising he proved beyond all doubt he was the Son of God and made it possible for all of us to achieve what God wishes for us, that is, we will one day share in the resurrection. Each Sunday is a celebration of the Lord's Resurrection, let us come to our Church each weekend to praise, petition and thank God for sending his Son to save us. Alleluia.
