Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 25 July 2021, Grandparent's Day Gift of love

We meet Jesus today in a situation of need. The crowds have followed him and they are hungry. Jesus challenges his disciples to provide a meal for them. When they object that they don't have enough money, and only a tiny amount of food, Jesus uses what they have to pull off a remarkable feat (and feast). For us, this Gospel might bring to mind the situation of migrants and asylum -seekers who experience hunger and hardship today. We are left in no doubt about our obligation to protect and care for those in need, just as Jesus provided for the hungry crowds. This feeding account also has the elements of a Eucharistic meal, with Jesus taking the food, giving thanks, and distributing it to everyone. Jesus doesn't produce this meal from nothing, but transforms what the disciples provide into a blessing for many.

Sharing in Eucharist means sharing our resources. It means ensuring people are not left to fend for themselves in crisis situations. When we receive the body of Jesus, it is a gift of love. But if we do not give and love in return, we are wasting the gift. Where people are in need, it is our responsibility, as followers of Jesus, to share and to provide. God will provide beyond our imagining, no matter how little we think we have to give, but we are invited to take the first step.

'If there is hunger anywhere in the world, then our celebration of the Eucharist is somehow incomplete everywhere in the world... We cannot properly receive the Bread of Life unless at the same time we give the bread of life to those in need wherever and whoever they may be.' (Pedro Arrupe SJ)

World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly Sunday 25th July

On 31 January 2021, Pope Francis announced, after the Sunday Angelus, that the First World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated on Sunday, 25 July, the Sunday nearest the memorial of Ss Joachim and Anne (26 July). The voice of the elderly 'is precious,' Pope Francis said, 'because it sings the praises of God and preserves the roots of the peoples.' The elderly, he continued, 'remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between the different generation, to pass on to the young the experience of life.'

The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this inaugural commemoration is 'I am with you always' (Mt 28:20). It expresses the closeness of the Lord and the Church to every older person, especially in these challenging times of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The theme, 'I am with you always' is also 'a promise of closeness and hope that young and old can mutually share', notes the press release. Not only are grandchildren and youths invited to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelisation, proclamation and prayer and of encouraging young people in their faith.

Reflection for 24th & 25th July (Grandparents day and the Elderly) St Anne and St Joachim

While very little is known of these two celebrated grandparents there is according to tradition some information concerning their lives found in the 2nd century "First Gospel of James" and the 3rd century "Gospel of the Nativity of Mary". Anne was born in Bethlehem in Judaea. She met and fell in love with Joachim. They were both wealthy and lived a devout life together. However their marriage was not complete as they had no family. Joachim suffered from being taunted at the Temple for his sterility. Anne too, was embarrassed at having no family and knew how Joachim suffered. One day unexpectedly Joachim disappeared and escaped into the countryside as he wanted to spend more time in prayer. Anne, grieved at the disappearance of her beloved Joachim. However, she knew she had to do something to help her husband. She implored the Lord and solemnly promised that if their prayer was answered she would dedicate their child to the Lord's service. The Lord answered her plea and sent an Angel to both Anne and Joachim telling them that Anne would conceive a most wonderous child. Joachim and Anne returned to their home and there was great excitement when their baby daughter was born. Anne named her Mary. Anne and Joachim enjoyed their miraculous parenthood for three whole years together. Then Anne, wishing to keep her promise, she and Joachim brought Mary to the Temple of Jerusalem and left her there to be brought up. Once there, the toddler proceeded to climb the 15 Temple steps that led to the Holy of Holies. This innermost part of the Temple was a place where only the High Priest could enter to make sacrifice and even then only one day out of every year. No doubt at the prompting of the Holy Spirit, the High Priest (the Orthodox churches teach that Zechariah was the High Priest that year, the father of John the Baptist) did not turn the child away, but even took her into the holy site. Mary remained in the Temple until the time when she was betrothed to Joseph, shortly before the Annunciation, which tradition says took place in Nazareth and not in Jerusalem. Today we celebrate the most holy of grandparents St Anne and St Joachim. Happy Grandparents Day and Happy feast day of the Elderly...we salute you.
