Synodal Pathway

In these days, the Catholic Church throughout the world and in Ireland is beginning a series of conversations about what God wants of his people at this time. These conversations are often referred to as a Synodal Process. "Synodal" comes from a Greek word which means "walking together".

On Sunday 17th October we mark the opening of this Synodal Process entitled, For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission. This Synodal Process coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel

1. Jesus had spent much time teaching his followers that discipleship was a life of service, a life of giving oneself for others. In spite of that James and John were thinking of what they could get out of it. For Jesus, for the apostles, and for each one of us, the glory of God is revealed when we allow God to work through us as we give ourselves for others. When have you found that you reach a fuller life, and others benefit, when you act in this spirit of service?

2. One of the great problems in a community, a parish, or an organisation, is when you have some people jockeying for status and positions of power. The good of the group and the people it serves take second place to personal prestige. You have probably seen this happen. Perhaps you have also witnessed people with a spirit of service that allowed them to value the good of the group over personal rewards. Recall them and give thanks for their witness. 3. Jesus himself is the great model of this spirit of service. Think of the aspects of Jesus' life and ministry that have inspired you to imitate his giving of his life for others.

The parish and curacies can claim back income tax paid by subscribers of €250.00 or over in the year. It will not cost the tax payer anything. Last year we received through this scheme a total of \notin 4,247.70, which was great, considering especially with fundraising non-existent from sources outside the church, through various events. "Faith is seeing light with your heart, when all your eyes see is darkness"

Reflection for weekend 16th Oct & 17th Oct 2021 WHAT IS FAITH ?.

People need to ask, "What is faith for me? If it is mainly a duty or a bargaining chip, we are off track, because salvation is a gift and not a duty; it is free and cannot be bought," If I do something to get what I need this is a commercial relationship with God, a quid pro quo. Faith is born and reborn: not from a duty, not from something that is to be done, but from a look of love to be welcomed. In this way Christian life becomes beautiful, if it is based not on our abilities and our plans, but on God's gaze," Pope Francis says. The pope said, "Often, we do the bare minimum, whereas Jesus invites us to do the maximum possible. How many times are we satisfied with doing our duties - the precepts and a few prayers — whereas God, who gives us life," asks for passion in return. Jesus shows the need to go from a sense of duty to an attitude of loving and freely giving, he said. The Ten Commandments lead to positive action. "Faith cannot be limited to 'do not,' because Christian life is a 'yes,' a 'yes'

of love." "A faith without giving, without gratuitousness, without works of charity, makes us sad in the end," the pope said.

If people feel their faith has become "tired" or they want to "reinvigorate it," he said, "look for God's gaze: sit in adoration, allow yourself to be forgiven in confession, stand before the crucified one. In short, let yourself be loved by him."

Hook of Faith

Jordan Peterson is a Canadian psychologist who shot to fame with his 2018 book 12 Rules for Life which became an international bestseller. In the book Peterson argues that the call to virtue and moral integrity is a requirement to achieve our potential. On his feast day on 22nd October, we compare this message to the witness of St John Paul II. We have a homily for the Twenty-Ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time by Sr Louise O'Rourke who reflects on Jesus' mission to serve and not be served. We have the usual newsletter insert and Pope Francis's message for World Youth Day 2021. Our video this week is by actor Denzel Washington who explains his conversion to Christianity.
