World Mission Sunday


What is World Mission Sunday? World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal to support overseas mission and missionaries. It takes place in every single parish worldwide where the Church is present. In Ireland, Missio Ireland is tasked with organising the Mission Sunday collection. Missio Ireland is the Pope's official charity for overseas mission.

Why is it so important? All offerings made on behalf of World Mission Sunday become part of the Holy Father's Universal Solidarity Fund. This Fund supports missionary activities in over 1,100 young dioceses, mostly in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. As young dioceses grow, so do their needs. On top of this, they are often found in remote areas devastated by conflict or natural disasters. The Universal Solidarity Fund provides aid so that missionaries can continue to go to these places to share the love of God.

What does it support? The needs of young dioceses vary, anything from a motorbike so a priest can celebrate Mass in a remote village, to a community hall so local people can gather in safety; or more urgently, vaccinations and medicines so that parish dispensaries can protect vulnerable children. In essence: • it provides basic infrastructure by helping communities to build schools, clinics, parish halls and churches. • it prepares the future leaders and carers of the Church by supporting the training of sisters, priests, brothers and catechists. • it supports missionary programmes to care for children's spiritual and physical wellbeing by offering safe shelter, healthcare, education and hope for the future.

What is the theme for World Mission Sunday? This year's theme is 'You Will Be My Witnesses' (Acts 1: 8). Every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ. The Church, the community of Christ's disciples, has no other mission than that of bringing the Gospel to the entire world by bearing witness to Christ. Each baptised person is called to mission, in the Church and by the mandate of the Church.

Sunday 9th October and World Mission Sunday is a time for the faithful of the world to show their appreciation towards the work of overseas missionaries. The generosity offered will be used to support missionary activities in over 1,100 struggling dioceses, mostly in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. You can help right now. **Twenty-Eighth Sunday in
Ordinary Time
9th October 2022**

1. The cure of the lepers is not just a
physical cure, it also brought the people
healed back from exclusion into the com-
munity. Perhaps you have experienced
the movement from exclusion to inclu-
sion. What was it like for you to be ac-
cepted once again when you had felt ex-
cluded?
2. Who were the Jesus people for you
who brought about this change? For
whom have been able to do this, perhaps
by healing a rift with a friend, or by lis-
tening to the opinion of someone you had
dismissed out of hand, or by opening the
door in some other way to another?
3. Some people work hard at breaking
down barriers in society, seeking inclu-
sion for those who find themselves la-
belled as lepers by society or by a section
of society. Where have you seen this
happening? Who has been doing this
kind of work? Where is the good news in
such action?
4. When we do good for another, we may
not do it for the thanks we hope to get,
but it can hurt when no gratitude is
shown. Sometimes it is those closest to
us who can take us for granted. What
helps you to cope in such circumstances?
5. How have you experienced the posi-
tive effects of thanks given and received?

Eircode
