

First Sunday of Lent



SEASON OF LENT

is called Shrove or Pancake Tuesday. Both titles have their own significance. We call it 'Pancake Tuesday' because in the past the Fast during Lent was very strict and before the season started the people used up the surplus food in the home, which at the best of times was scarce and the variety rather lacking. The normal food in the house was milk, flour, eggs, butter, and salt. They used these which are the ingredients for pancakes so that they would not be tempted to over indulge in food during Lent. It was called 'Shrove Tuesday' because it was the last day before Lent to go to confession to be shriven (absolved) of their sins. In the past this was the great day for going to confession and then the people did penance for their sins for the next forty days. We are given this great Season of Lent to do Penance for our sins, to Pray and give Alms. We have the forty days because Jesus fasted in the desert for forty days and nights to prepare himself for his three years of public ministry, so Jesus was 30 years of age at that time, as he died at the age of 33 years. Please make an effort to follow the example of Jesus by

making a few resolutions to Pray, Fast and give Alms. **Stations of the Cross** will take place in Ferns Church on Monday evenings during Lent at 7.00p.m.

Mass in Clologue Church will take place on Tuesday mornings at 9.45a.m. Mass in Ballyduff Church will take place on Wednesday evenings at 7.30p.m. Also you could visit the Pastoral Centre where there is daily Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 10.00am to 1.00pm.

First Sunday of Lent, 18th February 2024

- 1. Jesus he is about to start his public ministry. Mark tells us this was preceded by a deep inner struggle when his resolve to take on his God-given mission was tested. Recall important decisions in your own life. Were they accompanied by struggle and doubt? Who were the angels who supported you at that time? Give thanks for them.
- 2. Such periods of anxiety may seem like wilderness experiences at the time. Later, with hindsight, we may see them as being good for us. Perhaps, like Jesus, you recall a time when the Spirit of God led you into the wilderness to be tested and after the experience you had a clearer sense of your own identity or your purpose in life.
- 3. Repent and believe the good news was the heart of the message of Jesus. It was not a call to penance but to a change of heart, a change of attitude, leading to a change in behaviour. The kingdom of God is a kingdom of right relationships: with God, with one another, with creation, with ourselves. It is a change that leads to a fuller life. When have you found that a change in vour attitude towards God, others, vourself, or the world around you, has led you to a more fulfilled or more fruitful life?
- 4. There is an immediacy about the call of Jesus: 'the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near'. Recall when you had a realisation that NOW was the moment of opportunity – for a change in your life, for a spiritual renewal, or a time to give a wholehearted ves to life. At this moment to what do you believe you are invited to say 'ves'?

Synodal Journey

The continued success of the Synodal journey already begun in our Diocese requires on-going engagement in our parish communities.

As part of this journey seven people will be chosen which will include one Priest and one Religious who will undertake training as facilitators to work with parishes and other groups in the Diocese to continue to develop Synodality in the life and mission of the Church in Ferns. This training will begin in April.

We are also currently preparing two documents one on best practice of synodality in the diocese and the second on How can we imagine the life of the Church in Ireland where people are co-responsible for the Church's mission in different ways. These documents have to be submitted by March 25th and they will be sent as part of the Irish National Synodal Team to Rome for the Synod meeting in October next.
